Shared E-scooters and E-bikes in Coquitlam

It's now easier to get around Coquitlam City Centre with the launch of two new e-scooter and e-bike sharing services, providing 450 e-scooters and 130 e-bikes for the City's pilot e-mobility program. These alternative, green transportation modes create a convenient form of active transportation around urban areas and transit hubs. They are an important part of achieving the proposed goals of the City's Strategic Transportation Plan, including 50 per cent sustainable transportation by 2050 and zero transportation GHG emissions.

Each e-scooter and e-bike has a helmet, speed limitations (maximum of 24 kilometres/hour) and geofencing technology to ensure the devices operate only within designated areas. Dates will soon be announced for in-person community micromobility education workshops, with the support of City staff and HUB Cycling.

Improvements to Mariner Park Tennis Courts

Beginning in July, the existing tennis courts at Mariner Park (2985 Mariner Way) will be under construction. The work will include removal of the existing courts, followed by the installation of upgraded drainage, new tennis/pickleball courts and chain link fencing.
