Help Maintain Peaceful Neighbourhoods

The City's Bylaw Enforcement Officers are here to help with your noise or construction concerns. Construction-related noise is restricted to 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturdays. No excessive noise is allowed on Sundays or statutory holidays, but exceptions exist for home owners doing renovations between 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Workers are expected to behave in a respectful manner and refrain from playing loud music, using foul language, or otherwise disturbing the peace.

Everyone can be considerate to maintain a peaceful neighbourhood by limiting excessive noise that may disturb others like yelling, loud music, barking dogs and vehicle engine revving. Heat pumps and pool equipment noise can also be disruptive – it is important that they are located in areas with minimal impact on the quality of life of residents.
