





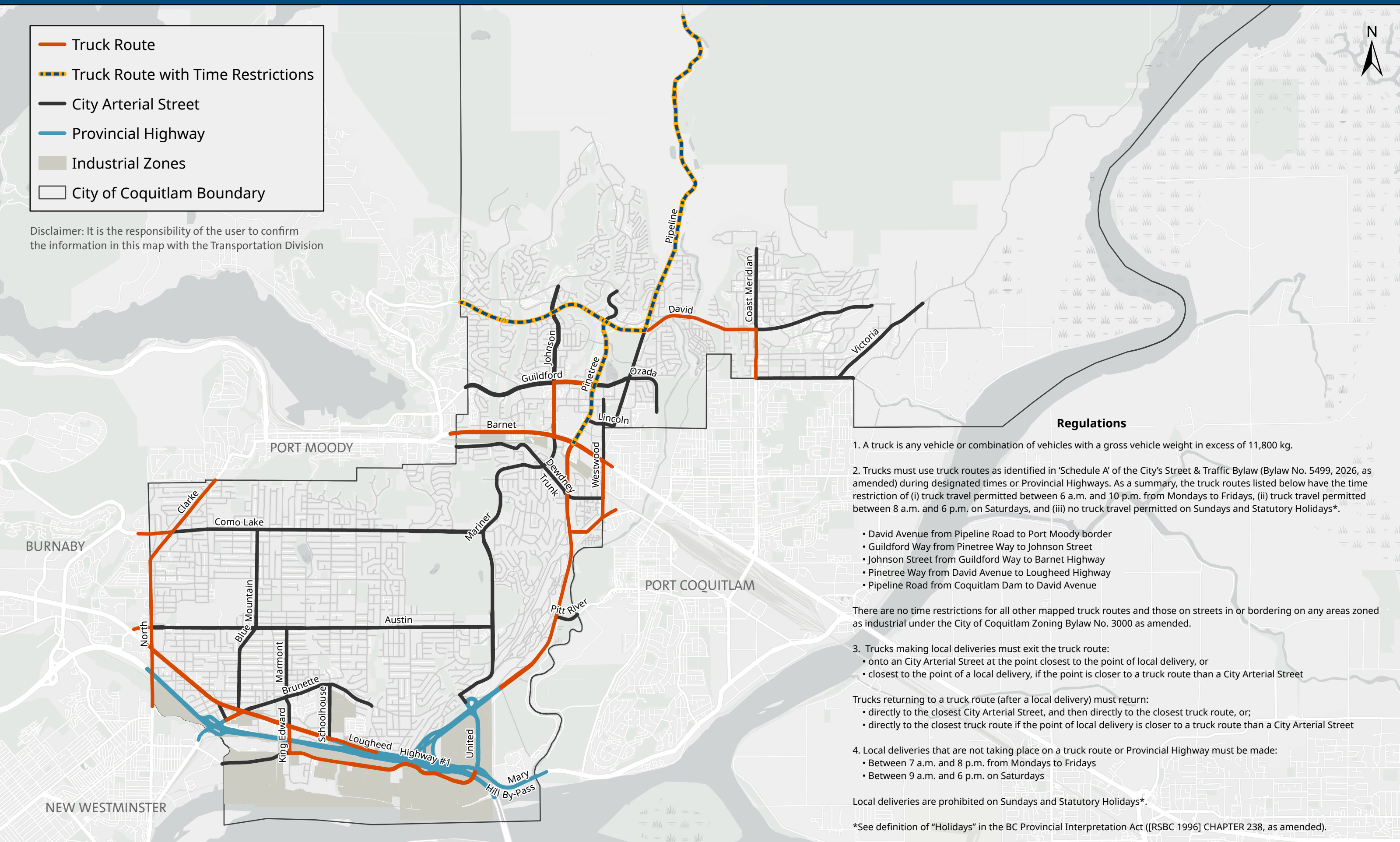


City of Coquitlam - Truck Route Map

Regulations

1. A truck is any vehicle or combination of vehicles with a gross vehicle weight in excess of 11,800 kg.
2. Trucks must use truck routes as identified in 'Schedule A' of the City's Street & Traffic Bylaw (Bylaw No. 5499, 2026, as amended) during designated times or Provincial Highways. As a summary, the truck routes listed below have the time restriction of (i) truck travel permitted between 6 a.m. and 10 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays, (ii) truck travel permitted between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Saturdays, and (iii) no truck travel permitted on Sundays and Statutory Holidays*.

- David Avenue from Pipeline Road to Port Moody border
- Guildford Way from Pinetree Way to Johnson Street
- Johnson Street from Guildford Way to Barnet Highway
- Pinetree Way from David Avenue to Lougheed Highway
- Pipeline Road from Coquitlam Dam to David Avenue

There are no time restrictions for all other mapped truck routes and those on streets in or bordering on any areas zoned as industrial under the City of Coquitlam Zoning Bylaw No. 3000 as amended.

3. Trucks making local deliveries must exit the truck route:
 - onto an City Arterial Street at the point closest to the point of local delivery, or
 - closest to the point of a local delivery, if the point is closer to a truck route than a City Arterial Street

Trucks returning to a truck route (after a local delivery) must return:

- directly to the closest City Arterial Street, and then directly to the closest truck route, or;
- directly to the closest truck route if the point of local delivery is closer to a truck route than a City Arterial Street

4. Local deliveries that are not taking place on a truck route or Provincial Highway must be made:
 - Between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays
 - Between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Saturdays

Local deliveries are prohibited on Sundays and Statutory Holidays*.

*See definition of "Holidays" in the BC Provincial Interpretation Act ([RSBC 1996] CHAPTER 238, as amended).
