PROCEED WITH CAUTION!

- Leave fireworks to the professionals. Do not use consumer fireworks.
- The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals.
- After the fireworks display, do not let children pick up leftover fireworks as they may still be active.

- >> The risk of fireworks injury is highest for children ages 5-14.
- More than 80% of emergency room fireworks injuries involve fireworks consumers are permitted to use.

CONSUMER FIREWORKS include sparklers and firecrackers. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1,200°, which is hot enough to cause 1100°F third-degree burns.
